

Pre-Cruise Information

Thank you for choosing Nomad Archipelago for your cruise. We're glad to have you join us in exploring the Indonesian Archipelago with purpose. To help you prepare, we've put together a set of guidelines and tips. If you have any further questions, feel free to reach out.

1. Contact

2. Accommodation

- On the Bugis: 4 double cabins, each with a double bed (140 x 200 cm) and a single bunk (90 x 200 cm).
- On the Bajau: 2 triple cabins (double + single bunk), and 2 twin cabins (two bunk beds) and per 01 June 2026: one of the Twin Cabin will be available as a twin cabin).
- All cabins are equipped with fans and private ensuite bathrooms.

3. Arrival & Pick-Up

Our Cruise Director will contact you at least two days prior to departure to confirm pick-up arrangements based on the details provided in your guest form.

4. Boarding & Orientation

On arrival, you'll be shown to your cabin and given a safety briefing, including the location of life jackets, rafts, and safety procedures. House rules will also be explained. Daily briefings will cover the day's route, activities, and cultural, social, and geographical context.

5. Climate

Expect tropical conditions: 27°C–32°C and high humidity (50%–90%).

- Rainy season: Nov–Mar (NW winds)
 - Dry season: Apr–Oct (SE winds)
- Itineraries are planned with these seasons in mind.

6. Social Etiquette

Indonesians are warm and hospitable, but may ask personal questions out of curiosity.

Key tips:

- Use your right hand for greetings and transactions.
 - Don't touch anyone's head.
 - Avoid pointing your feet at people.
 - Dress modestly, especially in Islamic regions.
 - No nudity or topless sunbathing.
- We provide sarongs for shore visits if needed.

7. Water & Electricity

Voltage onboard: 220V (European two-pin sockets). Bring a universal adapter. Filtered seawater is available via the tap in the restaurant and in refillable bottles provided.

8. Fellow Passengers

Expect a diverse mix: families, couples, and solo travellers from around the world.

9. Excursions

Excursions are included in regular trips (excluded for private charters). Your guide will offer daily options, which are voluntary. Note: Programs may change due to weather or local regulations.

10. Hotel Info Before/After

Let us know your accommodation details at least three days before departure to coordinate transfers. Please also inform us of your post-cruise plans.

11. Malaria

No mosquitoes at sea, but take precautions ashore. Wear long sleeves at dusk and use repellent. Consult a health professional about malaria medication and vaccinations before travelling.

12. Seasickness

Seasickness is rare but can occur. Tablets are available onboard if needed. Most guests adjust quickly to the motion of the sea.

13. Sun Protection

The sun is intense. Wear a hat, sunglasses, and SPF. Always snorkel with a T-shirt. Stay hydrated and consider adding extra salt to your food to avoid heatstroke.

14. Snorkelling

This is our main activity. Snorkeling gear is provided; however, you are welcome to bring your own mask for added comfort. We also recommend wearing a lycra top for UV protection while snorkeling.

15. Travel Insurance

Travel insurance is required. Cancellation insurance is optional—please arrange through your provider.

16. Medical Info

If necessary, place your medical details in a sealed envelope with your name and give it to your tour leader.

17. What to Pack

Casual and light clothing is best. Dress modestly ashore. Essentials:

- Photocopies of documents
- Cotton clothes
- Long trousers/skirts
- Rash guard
- Sweater/cardigan
- Swimwear
- Lycra
- Bathing shoes, sandals, hiking shoes
- Sunscreen (high SPF), insect repellent
- Personal medication, sting cream
- Waterproof bag, sunglasses, torch, cap
- Raincoat

18. Money & Payments

Currency: Indonesian Rupiah (IDR).

- Bring crisp USD/EUR/AUD notes (no older than 2002).
- Credit cards accepted onboard via EDC machine (fees: 1.85%–3.50%).
- Bring small denominations (1,000–10,000 IDR).
- ATMs and credit card acceptance are limited in remote areas.

19. Passport & Visa

Ensure your passport is valid for at least six months from arrival.

20. Time Zones

- WIB (GMT+7): Sumatra, Java, West Kalimantan
- WITA (GMT+8): Bali, Nusa Tenggara, Sulawesi
- WIT (GMT+9): Maluku, Papua

21. Toiletries

Eco-friendly toiletries (shampoo, soap, toothbrush, toothpaste, tissues) are provided onboard.

22. Internet Access

Buy a TELKOMSEL SIM card at the airport. Signal strength will vary based on location.

23. Alcohol

You may bring 1L of alcohol into Indonesia. Additional drinks are available for purchase onboard.

24. Onboard Guide

Our guides & Cruise Directors speak Indonesian and English and act as your liaison with local communities, authorities, and the crew. They coordinate daily activities and help interpret cultural experiences—especially in remote areas where flexibility is essential.

24. Schedule your international flight wisely

We highly recommend scheduling your international departure at least one day after your cruise arrival to ensure a worry-free onward journey.
